Application Questions. . .

1. What part of the text or message had the greatest impact on you? Where were you most encouraged, intrigued, or challenged?
2. Why do you think the Lord looked with favor on Abel and his offering but not on Cain and his offering (Hebrews 11:3)?
3. Re-read Gen. 6:5-6. Would you say mankind is morally better or about the same since the flood (8:21; Ps. 14:1-3; 58:3-4)?
4. Why does mankind continue to have such a struggle with sin, rebellion and disobedience?
5. The Bible reminds us that even righteous men like Noah always need to be on guard against falling into sin. What are some ways that we can guard against temptation (Rom. 13:11-14)?
6. In the story of the tower of Babel, the people desired to “make a name for themselves” (11:4). What does this mean? How are people trying to do this today? Why does it seldom work?
7. Have you ever built a “tower” for yourself only to have it shattered by God? What happened?
8. How is the unity you have found in Christ different than what you might find at “Babel?”
